4 year olds

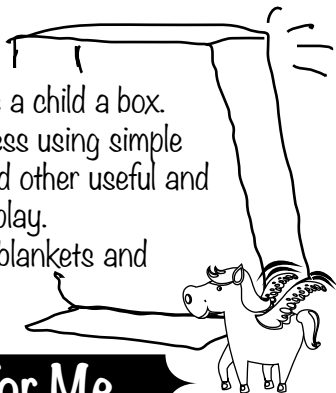
\*Children must be 4 years old by June 1, 2013

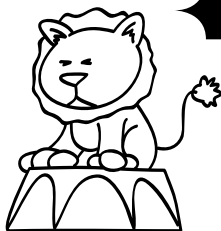
Now embellish that with a flashlight, a few blankets and sheets and the journey is like Neverland.

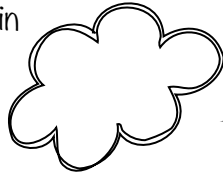
## Princess and Pirate Play

Become an amateur astronomer while pretending to travel to the depths of the universe. Discover exciting facts about our solar system and create your own space vest and other space creations.

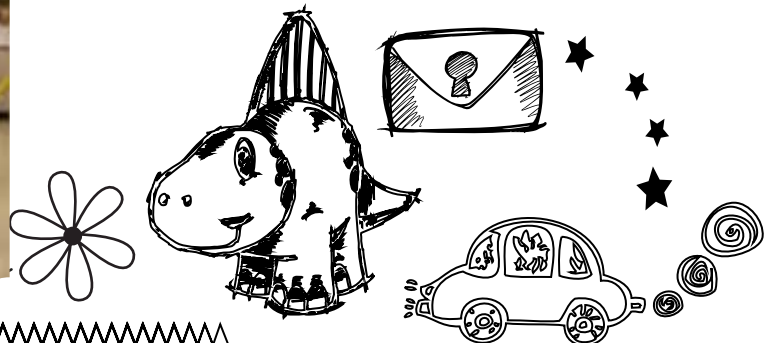


## Wheels, Wings and Whistles

An age-appropriate art-making journey into the world of color, shapes and textures, experimenting with various mediums while developing a child's awareness of art in everyday life.

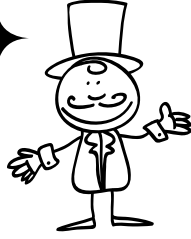


# Creative Workshops

5-6 & 7-8 year olds

## A Circus Life for Me

Make a clown hat, eat popcorn and delight in discovering the art of clown face-painting with a professional clown while practicing the art of balloon sculptures. Discover the art of Alexander Calder (he invented the mobile) by creating circus mobiles and imagine life under the "Big Top" creating and embellishing various art activities so natural to circus life.



Intended for children 5-8 years old, these workshops are designed as an artistic exploration to provide triggers for creativity using various creative disciplines, to introduce and immerse in cultural discoveries and to experience basic construction and scientific reinforcement while creating opportunities in a safe and nurturing environment for positive social interactions.

## Art Around the World

Young artists combine the fun and creativity of art with the mysteries of history, the lure of geography and the diversity of various cultures of the world. This journey is one with an interactive hands-on approach to many different countries focusing on the use of different art mediums and experiences. Children's best discoveries of global awareness are made when experiences are tactile and meaningful in their everyday life.



## Crazy About Critters

Filled with stories, games, crafts and special guest presenters sharing their furry, feathered and scaly animal friends with us, this class is certain to help fulfill the natural curious nature of children this age while building self-confidence as they investigate and explore some of nature's "crazy critters."

## Crazy About Cultures

Encouraging pretend play and hands-on interactive activities, children imagine a journey through several different countries or continents while discovering various facts about foods, clothing, art and languages.



## A Taste of Texas

What is so special about Texas? Well, everything! Discover interesting trivia about our unique state and explore the history that defines our rich culture. Experience the music, food, sports and, of course, rodeo season that make our state so extraordinary.



## Discovering Great Artists

Explore the styles and techniques of some of the world's greatest artists. Each art process focuses on one style and one artist. A brief biography and portrait of each artist assists children by inspiring them or adding depth to their own art. Artistic projects create opportunities for children to expand the creative experience and to "learn" by "doing."

## Clayfully Speaking

Explore and share in the magical versatility of clay by building coil pots, pinch pots, beads and masks. Adding embellishments such as straw, found objects or small colorful objects creates results to be cherished for many years to come.



## Flying Wonders

Brace yourselves as we construct an airplane glider, make paper airplanes from various types of paper, and assemble and launch small rockets while learning the basic principles of flight. Prepare to blast off!!!



## From Trash to Towers

This is the 5 and 6 year-old version of Construction Wizardry and focuses on the use of recycled materials to build beyond the imagination. While discovering some of the very basic principles of engineering and construction, students design and build structures and/or other projects to test the strength and practicality of their choices.

## Construction Wizardry

Build beyond the imagination while discovering the basics of engineering, construction design, and teamwork and building structures to test the strength of architect's designs with new and recycled materials.



## LEGO® Frenzy and Beyond

Using creative thinking and problem solving abilities, children design and build models with LEGO® pieces and kits to satisfy a specific purpose while exploring basic construction concepts, simple machines, mechanical advantage and how gears work. Young engineers are going to love this class!



## Paper Antics

Journey through the art of creating and embellishing various paper projects. This is a delightful exploration of the endless possibilities of what old and new paper or little and big paper can be used to create.

## Peace, Love and Rock 'n Roll



Discover some fascinating facts about the 60's such as the peace movements and popular music of that time. Take a look at the "groovy" side and tie-dye t-shirts, make leather necklaces and see how the times defined rock 'n roll. Peace out, man!!!!



## Simply Science

Science does not have to just sizzle to create curiosity and intense moments of observation. Using *Ms. Frizzle's The Magic School Bus™* curriculum as a base for some of our topics, explore the physical and chemical properties of different elements, compounds and mixtures as well as venture into topics like force and motion, earth science, light refraction and more.

## Snack Attack



Cook up a menu without touching a stove to make interesting, healthy and decorative snacks and crafts each day. Children strengthen eye and hand coordination while tempting the palate. Bring an appetite and join the fun!!!!

## Super Heroes Adventure

This curriculum draws from all of our art classes and combines Great Artists, Art Around the World, "Clayfully" Speaking, Construction Wizardry and Peace, Love and Rock 'n Roll to create "artful" experiences with a variety of mediums focusing on the process of art to explore new art ideas and techniques.

# Robotics

7-10 year olds

## E.A.R.L.Y. ROBOTICS (Engineering and Robotics Learned Young)

EARLY robotics is a program exposing 7-10 year-olds to engineering while developing a strong understanding of the basic fundamentals of building and mechanical principles. Building robots and realistic motorized models from LEGO® kits in a team-building atmosphere, teams select pilots to operate the robot using basic on/off switches manipulating through given obstacles and challenges to help complete the mission. Student engineers gear up for a friendly competition on the final day.



## WeDo™ Robotics

Designed for the early elementary learner, WeDo™ is an easy-to-use system that introduces boys and girls to the early principles of robotics. Children build LEGO® models featuring working motors and sensors, then program their robot models to write stories, solve problems or create innovative projects. Curriculum is designed to develop skills in science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

## Advanced E.A.R.L.Y. Robotics

Designed for the students who have previous EARLY robotics experience from other qualified programs and/or have participated in EARLY competitions, this program challenges students to work more quickly through the curriculum and take strategies to the next level. The curriculum will encompass more design and more challenging missions.

# Lunch Bunch

LUNCH BUNCH is offered for those children who (1) are signed up for both morning and afternoon classes; (2) attend morning classes but cannot be picked up at noon; or (3) attend afternoon classes but need to be dropped off before 1:00. Children are to bring a sack lunch and a drink. A staff member will assemble the children and escort them to a classroom where they will eat lunch and play quiet games, watch a short video, listen to a story, etc. Those who are attending an afternoon class will be escorted to that teacher; those who are leaving the museum will be released to the parent upon sign-out.

Registrations are not transferable from one child to another.

Please be advised that The Woodlands Children's Museum reserves the right to cancel classes in the event our classes do not meet a minimum enrollment. Patrons will receive a full refund. We appreciate your understanding.

Patrons who desire or need to cancel a registration will receive a 50% refund of the cost if notification is received at least 5 working days before class begins.

There are no refunds for registration cancelled or dropped less than 5 working days before class begins.

To receive a 50% refund, patrons must notify The Woodlands Children's Museum in writing (fax, mail or e-mail) or in person at The Woodlands Children's Museum no less than five working days prior to the first day of class.

## Frequently Asked Questions

**Q: Is the museum a non-profit organization?**

Yes! The Woodlands Children's Museum is a registered 501(c)3 non-profit organization. Donations are tax deductible to the extent allowed by law.

**Q: How do you accommodate my child's needs?**

In order for us to be able to help your child have an enjoyable experience with us, we ask that you notify us **at the time of registration** of any allergies, accessibility concerns, behavioral, psychological, emotional conditions or other special needs. Failure to inform The Museum of any conditions can result in the child's dismissal from the program. The Museum reserves the right to determine the compatibility of your child's needs within the program.

The Museum is **NOT** responsible for administering medication to children. Please consult your pediatrician about altering the child's dosage so that medication can be administered outside of our program.

**Q: What are the qualifications of your teachers and assistants?**

All of our teachers are certified and/or professionals in their field.

**Q: How are children supervised?**

Parents or guardians are required to physically bring their child(ren) into the museum's atrium. Children are supervised at all times and escorted on bathroom breaks. The museum reserves the right to remove a child from class if his/her behavior interferes with the curriculum.

**Q: May parents stay in the classroom?**

Our programs promote independent learning and socialization. If you feel that your child is unable to remain in class without you for more than a few minutes, we suggest waiting a year before sending him/her to our programs. Parents are required to sign out their child(ren) at the end of class.

**Q: Who can I contact during the day if I need to leave a message concerning my child?**

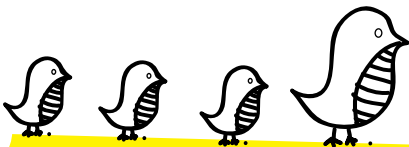
Please call The Woodlands Children's Museum at 281-465-0955 and a staff person will deliver your message.
